The New GSMP: An Integration of GSMP and EPC

- Committee structure similar to GSMP:
 - Standing bodies handling Maintenance Work Requests
 - Ad hoc work groups handling Development Work Requests
- Industry driven engagement model similar to EPCglobal's current methods for bringing community needs into the standards process
- Includes the development of all GS1 standards

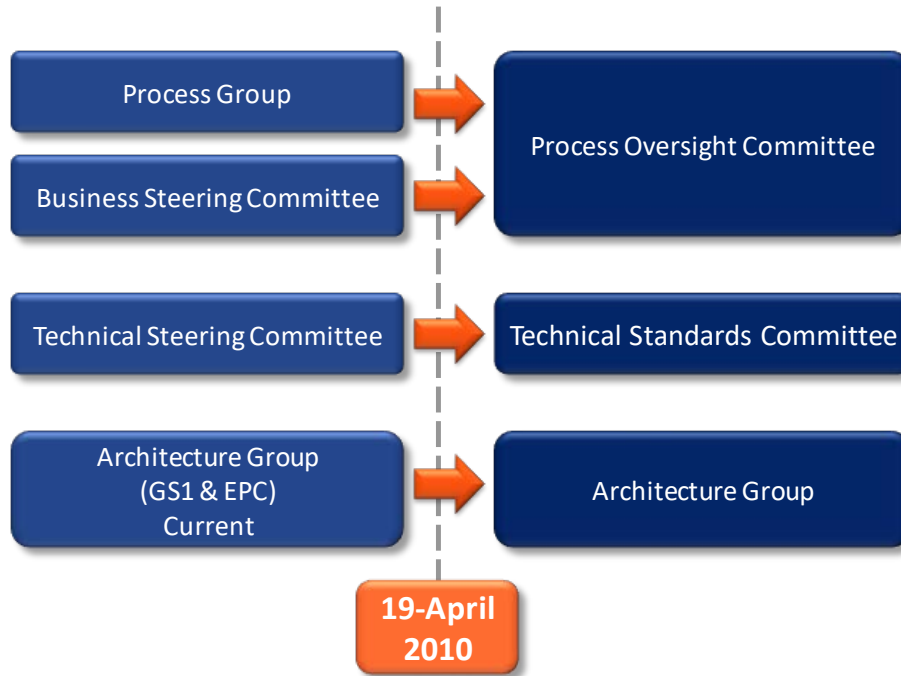


GSMP Governance and Support Structure

Governance Transition & Interim Ratification



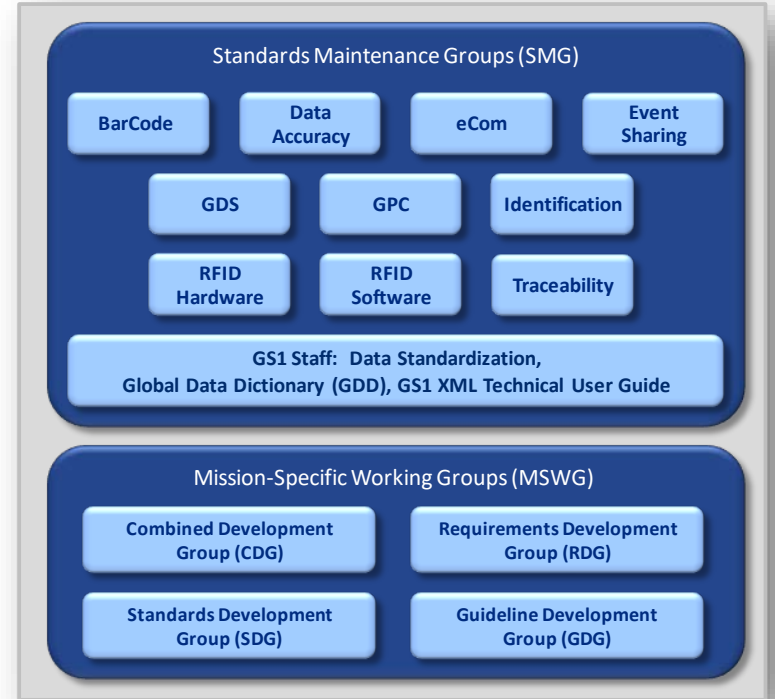
Governance Transition

- Governance: Groups are formed with grace period for signing of IPP
- New Governance requires roles of old Governance for closure to current processes

What is the Structure?

Working Groups fall under one of the following types:

- **Standards Maintenance Groups (SMG):**
Standing working groups composed of business process and GS1 standards experts
- **Mission-Specific Working Groups (MSWG):**
Formed to work on Development Work Requests or GSMP initiatives - are closed upon completion of the solution.

The Global Language of Business



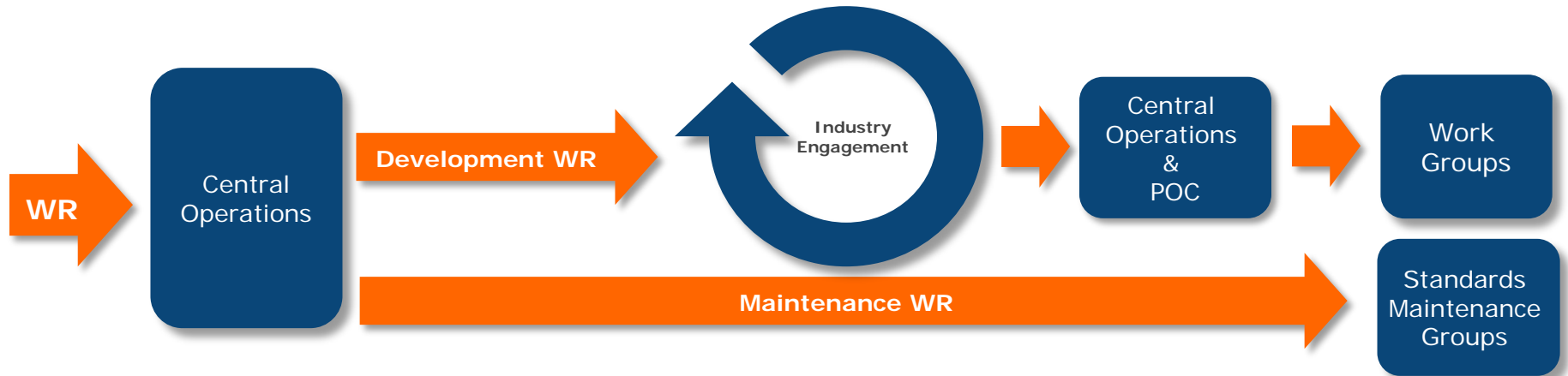
New GSMP 4-Step Process

- Single development process across GS1
- Common process for standards, guidelines
- Leverage the best practices across GS1
- Ensure industry and technical expertise
- Will ensure guiding principles of GS1 are maintained (GSMP and EPCglobal SDP)



Work Requests (WR)

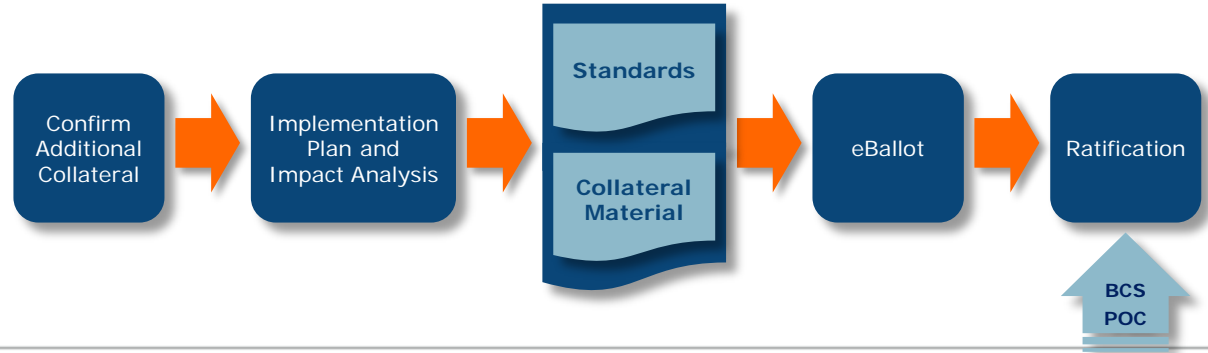
- Entry point into the GSMP process
- Transparency and visibility throughout the whole process



Can The GSMP Improve Delivery to the Member Organisation Community?

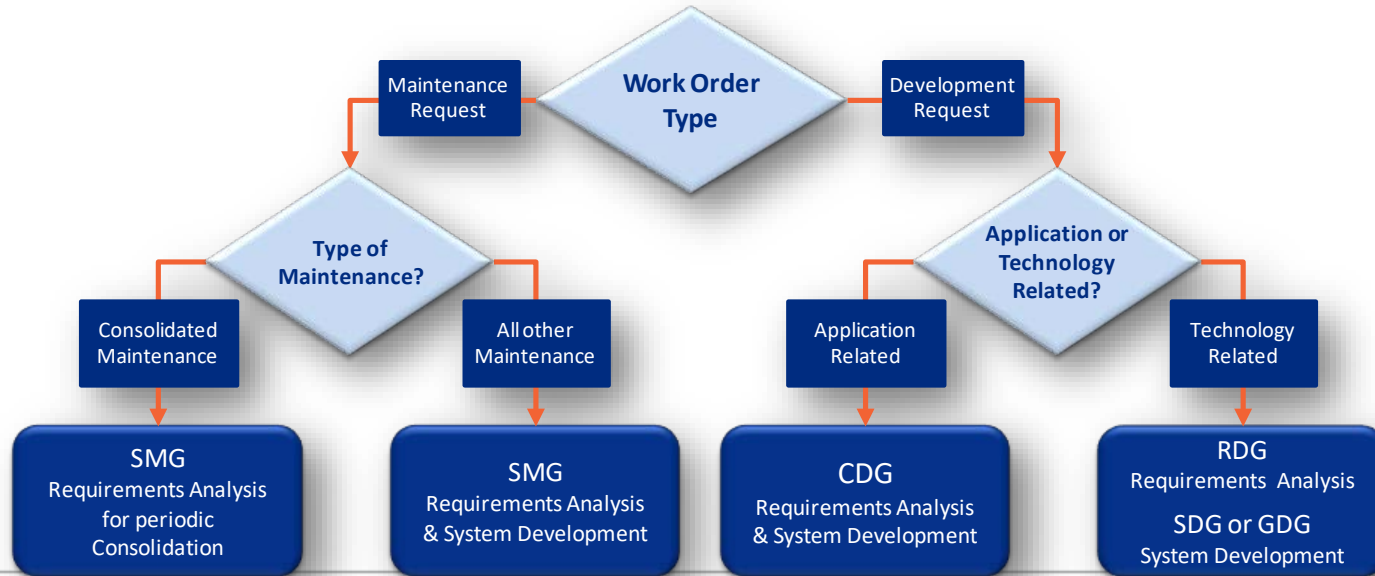


- Additional Collateral

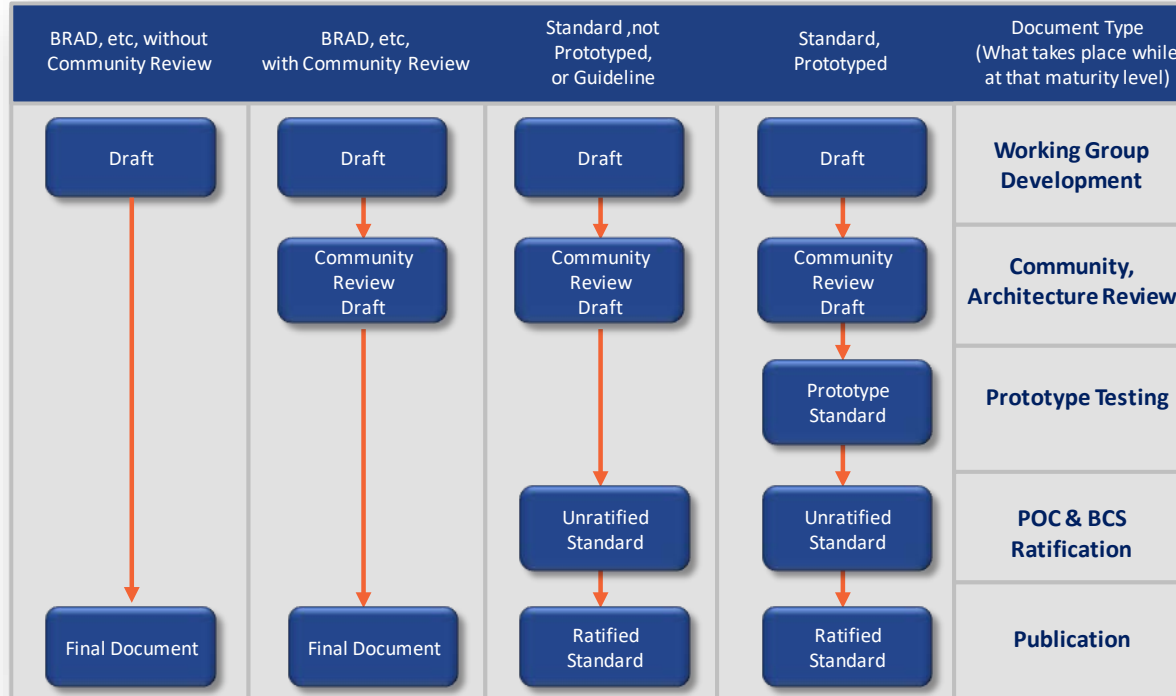


Work Requests and Work Orders

- Work Requests (WR) are submitted by the community to request new standards or modify existing standards
- WRs becomes Work Orders (WO) when work is initiated in GSMP Step 2 (Requirements).



Document Maturity Levels



GSMP Voting



- All GSMP members are eligible to vote
- Process-mandated voice motions:
 - Moves work from step to step
 - Subject to participation minimums - if not met, virtual motion required
- Community eBallot:
 - Progresses draft requirements and standard forward

GSMP Voting



GSMP minimums take the following form:

- A minimum of 12 organisations must participate.
- In addition, a minimum balance (“2-2-2”) of:
 - 2 MOs
 - 2 End Users from one side of the trading relationship
 - 2 End Users from the other side of the trading relationship

If a particular work effort requires unique minimums, they will be defined in in the Working Group Charter
